After I go through Macedonia, I will come to you—for I will be going through Macedonia. <sup>6</sup> Perhaps I will stay with you for a while, or even spend the winter, so that you can help me on my journey, wherever I go. <sup>7</sup> For I do not want to see you now and make only a passing visit; I hope to spend some time with you, if the Lord permits. <sup>8</sup> But I will stay on at Ephesus until Pentecost, <sup>9</sup> because a great door for effective work has opened to me, and there are many who oppose me.

### 1 Corinthians 16:10-12 <sup>NIV</sup>

When Timothy comes, see to it that he has nothing to fear while he is with you, for he is carrying on the work of the Lord, just as I am. <sup>11</sup> No one, then, should treat him with contempt. Send him on his way in peace so that he may return to me. I am expecting him along with the brothers. <sup>12</sup> Now about our brother Apollos: I strongly urged him to go to you with the brothers. He was quite unwilling to go now, but he will go when he has the opportunity.



### 1 Corinthians 16:10-12 <sup>NIV</sup>

When **Timothy** comes, see to it that he has nothing to fear while he is with you, for he is carrying on the work of the Lord, just as I am. <sup>11</sup> No one, then, should treat him with contempt. I urge you, brothers and sisters, <sup>16</sup> to submit to such people and to everyone who joins in the work and labors at it. <sup>17</sup> I was glad when **Stephanas, Fortunatus and Achaicus** arrived, because they have supplied what was lacking from you. <sup>18</sup> For they refreshed my spirit and yours also. Such men deserve recognition.



### 1 Corinthians 16:15-18 <sup>NIV</sup>

You know that the household of Stephanas were the first converts in Achaia, and they have devoted themselves to the service of the Lord's people. I urge you, brothers and sisters, <sup>16</sup> to submit to such people and to everyone who joins in the work and labors at it. <sup>17</sup> I was glad when Stephanas, Fortunatus and Achaicus arrived, because they have supplied what was lacking from you. <sup>18</sup> For they refreshed my spirit and yours also. **Such men deserve recognition.**

### 1 Corinthians 16:19-20 <sup>NIV</sup>

The churches in the province of Asia send you greetings. Aquila and Priscilla greet you warmly in the Lord, and so does the church that meets at their house. <sup>20</sup> All the brothers and sisters here send you greetings. Greet one another with a holy kiss.
